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JOINT RECOMMENDATIONS

WP-1/#01/EJ Strengthen the EU-Japan Economic Relationship

- Focus on addressing the remaining obstacles to the conclusion of a comprehensive, ambitious, high-level and mutually beneficial FTA/EPA as early as possible
- 2016 represents the best window of opportunity to conclude the negotiation
- Political leaders at the highest level should intervene to resolve the deadlocks and bring the negotiations to an ambitious conclusion



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JOINT RECOMMENDATIONS

- <u>WP-1/#02/EJ</u> Call for effective and quick implementation of WTO 'Bali Package' and work on a future WTO work program based on Nairobi Ministerial Conference Declaration
 - The BRT expects further progress in WTO's DDA negotiation to reach a new stage in negotiation, which should result in mutually beneficial outcome for both developed and developing countries

<u>WP-1/#03/EJ</u> Applying international standards and enhancing regulatory cooperation

- The BRT supports the joint development and application of internationally harmonised technical requirements and procedures for the testing and approval of products
- Enhance regulatory cooperation to eliminate barriers to trade and investment and to disseminate the experience of EU and Japan to the rest of the world



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JOINT RECOMMENDATIONS

<u>WP-1/#04/EJ</u> Support the timely development of business

- Make further efforts to expand the number of bilateral Social Security Agreements, and also
- Liberalise the movement of intra-corporate transferees within the framework of an EPA/FTA

WP-1/#05/EJ Support for SMEs

- Develop measures that will promote and assist each other's SMEs within their own jurisdictions as well as cross-support measures
- Examples: Tax breaks & incentives tax deduction for total research expenses, income tax breaks for foreign experts, tax exemption for doctoral students, tax relief for R&D, tax deduction for joint & entrusted industry-academic-government cooperative research



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JOINT RECOMMENDATIONS

<u>WP-1/#06/EJ</u> Recommendation on BEPS Action Plan and Other Tax Issues

- Implementation of BEPS (Base Erosion and Profit Shifting) Actions should not create additional administrative burden on business
- Pursue simpler, lighter and sensible tax systems
- Modernise the tax treaties between EU Member States and Japan to eliminate double taxation

WP-1/#07/E Recommendation on Financial Transaction Tax

 Serious concern over the EC's proposed Financial Transaction Tax, taking into account the impact on liquidity, funding costs and hedging costs

- Harmonisation and better recognition of standards and product certifications
- Kei cars and other vehicles should be put on the same fiscal and regulatory footing
- Hydrogen Fuel Cell Vehicles
